WORKSHOPS

COLLECTIVE BARGAINING

The focus of this workshop is a multi-day role-play that helps build high-level bargaining skills. If you are a bargaining committee member, here's your chance to work with real bargaining information and gain the experience you need when facing management. You'll also explore current issues like interest-based bargaining and bargaining for equality.

LEARNING ABOUT FIRST PEOPLE

In this workshop we will explore the impact of Canadian history on First Nations, Inuit and Métis, address common myths and stereotypes about Aboriginal peoples, come up with concrete ways to take action on key issues that are relevant for Aboriginal peoples today and develop plans to address them. All members are welcome to attend.

CREATING RACIAL JUSTICE

Stopping racism in the workplace and the union will benefit everyone. In this workshop we will deepen your understanding of racism, explore the history of racism and colonialism in North America, and explore how to be an ally for racial equality.

STEWARD LEARNING SERIES

CUPE is proud to offer our Steward Learning Series. This series recognizes that the steward has an important role to play in a number of areas in the workplace and the union. It provides an opportunity for stewards to explore a number of topics – all from a steward's point of view.

At this Weeklong School, we will offer:

- Handling Discipline and Discharge

- Mediating Member to Member Conflict
- Building Your Case

- What Stewards need to know about Health and Safety
- Handling Grievances

In order to register, you need to have taken the Introduction to Stewarding workshop and have some practical experience as a steward. Please bring your Collective Agreement and your Stewards Passport (if you have one).

LABOUR LEGISLATION (CHANGED)

This course will examine some of the basic statutes that affect our daily work lives, including employment standards, workers compensation, human rights and others. We will also explore recent legislative attacks on the ability of unions to advocate on behalf of workers.

ALBERTA DIVISION CONSTITUTION

Article 17 - CHILD CARE AND EXPENSES

Section 2

The Division may reimburse delegates for off-site child/dependent care expenses, unless such expenses would have been normally incurred had the employee been performing their regular work shift.

Within one (1) month of the close of a Division sponsored function, delegates, through their Local Unions, may apply to the Canadian Union of Public Employees Alberta Division for reimbursement of receipted child/dependent care expenses to a maximum of \$60.00 per day per child/dependent.

Original receipts of payment from the caregiver/facility must be provided with an accompanying letter from the Local Union verifying the costs, in addition to the "Child/Dependent Care" expense form provided by the Division Treasurer.


