New online workplace auditing tool

o you think your workplace is green? There is plenty of talk these days about workplaces going green. Now CUPE has developed a new quick, online Eco-audit that lets you know how green your workplace really is.

The Eco-audit tool is easy to use. It's all point and click, with a "green" score generated for each person who assesses their workplace's environmental performance. The auditing tool looks at climate change, green meetings, transportation, paper use, cleaning products, waste/ recycling, lighting and other factors. The tool was launched on Earth Day 2008 to highlight environmental awareness and action at work. Hundreds of people have since conducted environmental audits of their workplaces using CUPE's Ecoaudit. It helps show where you're doing well and where your workplace needs to make improvements.
