The federal government is all talk and no action. It's letting corporations and some provinces push privatization and prey on the sick and vulnerable. While the Romanow report rejects most for-profit care, it doesn't close the door on privatization and public private partnerships (P3s). We must slam that door shut.

Only massive mobilization and an all-out fightback will force governments to act in the public interest, protecting and expanding a health care system that's public from top to bottom. CUPE members are key to the fight – in our workplaces and communities, in the streets, at the ballot box and pressuring governments – especially the federal government.

Act now for public health care.

Privatization alert

From hospitals to housekeeping, privatization continues to threaten public health care. The evidence is clear: patients, health care workers and communities can't afford the dangerous costs of for-profit care.

Health support workers are especially at risk. Governments and employers are targeting food, laundry, housekeeping and other support work. Yet these services are vital to recovery and healing. The attack is already underway in British Columbia, where the Liberal government has ripped up health care contracts to clear the way for massive contracting out and privatization.

CUPE members from every sector are organizing to protect these jobs and services. They're also fighting to stop for-profit hospitals and clinics. P3 hospitals bring major cuts in beds and staff, cuts that can threaten lives. For-profit facilities drain money from care into corporate pockets, eroding quality, access and accountability – and putting good jobs at risk.

Across the country CUPE members are joining with other Canadians to defend jobs and services, resisting profits anywhere in the health system.
