GENERAL INFORMATION

Weeklong School

This is the 48th anniversary of the CUPE Weeklong School in Manitoba. The Weeklong School provides a community atmosphere where learning, relaxation and fun are combined. The objective is to give CUPE leaders the opportunity to develop specialized skills in programs that are interesting and challenging.

Cost

Includes rooms, meals, and registration from Sunday afternoon to Friday noon. Costs are per person as follows:

- \$915 for single rooms.
- \$690 for double occupancy (sharing room with another delegate).

<u>Note:</u> Please <u>do not</u> book rooms directly with the Russell Inn. We will assign rooms to the delegates, based on the requirements indicated on their registration forms. The Russell Inn is a **non-smoking facility**, however, members who smoke will be permitted to do so outside on their hotel room patio.

• Children:

- No cost for children under 3 years old participating in meals.
- For children over 3 years old, the Russell Inn will arrange individual meal plans.
- Limited space is available at three Russell day care facilities for minimal cost.
 Participants are asked to contact Shirley Campbell at the Russell Inn directly to make child care arrangements. The hotel will charge the applicable costs to the parents and they will be responsible for paying upon check-out. • Spouses:

- If delegates would like to bring their spouse, the Russell Inn will arrange a meal plan. There is no charge for a spouse who does not participate in the meal plan, however, the delegate must pay the single occupancy rate.

• Special Diets:

- Participants requiring special meals as a result of food allergies/restrictions or who follow religious/life choice diets are requested to **contact the Russell Inn directly** with their special dietary requirements <u>at least 10 working days in advance of the school</u> to arrange an alternate menu plan. - Acceptance is on first come, first served basis.
- Registration is limited to 20 participants per workshop, except where otherwise indicated.

- We reserve the right to limit the number of participants from the same local in any workshop. Participants <u>must</u> indicate a second workshop choice.

BURSARIES

Two bursaries are available from CUPE Manitoba, as follows:

#1. Locals in Financial Need:

The first bursary in the amount of \$1,000 is available to a small local or a local in financial need. Where there is more than one local applying, priority will be given to locals most in need of financial assistance and/or to a local sending a participant who has not been to the Weeklong School before.

#2. Young Member Bursary:



Where there is more than one local applying, priority will be given to "young activists" who have never been to the Weeklong School, diversity activists, and locals most in need of financial assistance.

- Bursary notices and an application form are included in this package. Deadline for all bursary applications is <u>April 25, 2014</u>. Recipients will be advised of the decision of the CUPE Manitoba Executive by early May.
- A copy of your local's last Trustees' Report must accompany all bursary applications.


