Dear Prime Minister Harper:

Re: Conflict in Gaza

The Canadian Union of Public Employees (CUPE) is deeply concerned about the escalating conflict between Israel and Palestine. The death toll is growing with over 200 people killed in Gaza, and one person in Israel. We recognize the previous demand of the Government of Canada for a ceasefire, and further call on you to demonstrate genuine support and recognition of human rights and international humanitarian law as a principle underlying this demand.

Devastating violence has been inflicted on thousands of innocent people in Israel and Palestine, with impacts that will last generations. It is not a secret that the people in the Gaza Strip are being disproportionately affected by this violence as is evident in the rising death toll.


Peace in the region cannot be achieved unless there is an immediate halt to the bombardment against Gaza, an end to rockets sent by Hamas, the end to the blockade against Gaza and the end of the illegal occupations of the Palestinian territories by Israel.

Collective punishment that targets civilians and infrastructure in Gaza such as hospitals. schools and water systems warrants an immediate condemnation from the international community including the Government of Canada.

As an affiliate of Public Services International (PSI), we support the call for "a democratic." inclusive and non-sectarian approach that can provide a lasting peace to the conflict, and this is conditional on the dismantling of all oppressive instruments, including legislative, military, political, social, economic and political barriers." We agree that at the very least this must involve:
