The COVIDEM project

COVIDEM is a pan-Canadian research project funded by the Canadian Institutes of Health Research (CIHR) to explore the psychological distress experienced by environmental service workers (ESW) during the COVID-19 pandemic

Context: Environmental service workers in hospitals are on the front line of the fight against COVID-19. They expose themselves, put themselves at risk and work tirelessly to ensure the safety of all patients and hospital staff. However, these tasks and responsibilities can cause the ESWs to experience heightened psychological stress, or distress. It is thus crucial to learn more about the experience of these essential front line workers.

The team: The principal investigators of this project (Dr. Marie-Hélène Chomienne and Dr. Jean Grenier) in partnership with CUPE, HIROC, HealthCareCAN, are committed to explore on a national scale, the psychological distress experienced by ESWs during the COVID-19 pandemic.

The aims are to 1) measure the psychological distress (PD); 2) identify the various institutional and non-institutional factors that influence PD; and 3) inform health institutions about strategies and processes that may help minimize or prevent PD in ESWs during a pandemic.
