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A Guide to Getting Your Pension Fund to Cover the Cost of Pension Trustee Training

Pension trustees need education and training to carry out their responsibilities. It's common for pension funds to pay for trustee training, including training put on by the union. In fact, pension funds regularly pay for union trustees to attend union-provided pension training.
