- (a) a Local Union chartered after the end of the previous fiscal year at a regular Convention;
- (b) a Local Union chartered after the sending of the Convention call at a special Convention; or
- (c) a Local Union affected by a transfer of jurisdiction or other special circumstances at a regular or special Convention.

The Credentials Committee will report these situations to Convention for approval.

- No chartered organization, in arrears for two or more months, will be allowed representation at Convention or any convention of any other level of the Union.
- 6.8(a) Only a member in good standing of a Local Union can be a delegate representing that Local Union. Only a member in good standing of a Provincial Division, District Council, Service Division, Provincial Council of Unions, Council of Unions or Airline Division Component to which their Local Union is affiliated can be a delegate representing that organization.

(b) A full-time elected officer or appointed official of a Local Union, Provincial Division, District Council, Service Division, Provincial Council of Unions, Council of Unions or Airline Division Component can be recognized as a delegate representing that organization only if the officer or official was a member in good standing of a Local Union and covered by the collective agreement of that Local Union when elected or appointed to office.

RESOLUTIONS AND PROPOSED CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENTS

Please note that **July 8, 2025**, was the deadline date for the submission of resolutions and proposed constitutional amendments. Further resolutions received will be considered as "late resolutions" and will be dealt with in accordance with Article 6.11(b) of the CUPE Constitution. A copy of all resolutions and proposed constitutional amendments properly submitted in accordance with Article 6.11(a) will be posted on CUPE's website by

CREDENTIALS

September 5, 2025.

Enclosed you will find the credential and alternate form links assigned to your chartered organization. Each electronic form is to be sent back to the CUPE National Office no later than August 22, 2025, together with the \$250 registration fee. THE CONFIRMATION EMAIL RECEIVED ONCE THE ELECTRONIC CREDENTIAL HAS BEEN SENT TO CUPE IS TO BE RETAINED BY THE DELEGATE (OR ALTERNATE) FOR PRESENTATION AT REGISTRATION IN TORONTO.

You should notify national office of any change in delegate(s) or alternate(s) prior to the opening of the national convention. If prior notification cannot be given, the replacing delegate (or alternate) should have in his/her possession, at the time of registration at convention, a letter from the chartered organization (signed by the president and secretary) outlining the change.

ELECTION CANDIDATES

CUPE's policy restricts campaign material for candidates standing for election to one pre-convention letter, and one poster, one button, and one piece of printed material at convention.

Delegates standing for election may obtain CUPE's policy by contacting CUPE's convention office.

HOTEL RESERVATIONS

The enclosed hotel reservation form lists the hotels where accommodation is available. W.E. Union Travel is in charge of coordinating the bookings for CUPE delegates and you will receive confirmation directly from the hotel. If you have not yet made your hotel arrangements, please be sure to follow the directions on the enclosed form.

DELEGATES WITH A DISABILITY

The CUPE National Executive Board (NEB) has adopted a policy to ensure that members with disabilities do not face barriers to participation at national convention or at national events.

CUPE will pay 100 per cent of the additional costs directly related to necessary equipment, or to the assistance of a personal attendant, required by a delegate with a disability for the duration of the conference or convention. All other costs related to delegates' participation at the national convention remain the responsibility of the chartered organization they are representing.

In order that we may accommodate these special needs, the delegate should complete the enclosed form, which must be submitted with the credential by August 22, 2025.

CHILD CARE ARRANGEMENTS

ON-SITE: Child care facilities will be made available during the convention proceedings. The enclosed application is to be completed by the delegate(s) requiring these services, and must be received by the national office no later than **August 22, 2025**.

AT-HOME: Article 6.3(d) of the CUPE Constitution provides for a subsidy to offset at-home child care and family care costs to a maximum of \$90 per day per delegate. Requests for this subsidy should be made by the local union following convention. The enclosed application must be completed and received by the National Secretary-Treasurer no later than

February 13, 2026.

YOUTH COUNCIL

CUPE Youth Council is a week-long education program where youth aged 9 to 14 can connect, grow and develop their understanding of unions and social justice while parents and guardians attend the 2025 national convention. National convention delegates previously adopted a resolution to provide this program as a way to engage young people in the labour movement, build their confidence and nurture the next generation of leaders.

All Youth Council participants will have guest status and will be able to visit the convention floor during the proceedings. At the end of the week, they will prepare a report about their activities and present it to convention delegates.

If you wish for your child to participate in this program, please complete the attached application form and send it to the national office together with a cheque in the amount of \$200 per child **TO BE RECEIVED NO LATER THAN AUGUST 22, 2025**.

Because our children's programs are set up in advance of convention, it is not possible to accommodate registrations made for either the on-site child care or the Youth Council after August 22, 2025, nor will refunds be possible
